4. Toast until heated through and egg is cooked. 1 serve of fruit. Serves 2.

### 2014 Year 6 Canberra Excursion

The Year 6 major excursion for 2014 is a 5-day trip to Canberra. The excursion is confirmed for Monday, 12th May to Friday, 16th May 2014. To secure a place, students are required to pay a non-refundable deposit of \$50.00, which must be paid by 1:00pm on Friday, 13th December 2013. If no deposit is paid by the due date it will be assumed that your child will not be attending. The approximate cost of the excursion is \$560. This amount includes your deposit of \$50.00, so when you pay a \$50.00 deposit, you will owe \$510. You may pay in weekly/fortnightly instalments if you wish.

For the Year 1 end of year party day on Wednesday, 18 December, students have a picnic day at Walka Water Works located in Maitland. We will be travelling to and from the venue by bus leaving at 9.30 am and returning by 3.00 pm. Children will be accompanied by the Year 1 teachers and learning support officers. The children and teachers are looking forward to enjoying this special day together. Some students from the Support Unit will also be attending.

Upon arrival at Walka Water Works the group will have a play on the equipment in the park and then have lunch. Children need to bring **their own** lunch and recess with 2 drinks and a special party treat for themselves (no sharing of food please). They can wear party clothes but need a **hat** and **good walking shoes** (please, not open shoes, high heels or thongs).

The cost will be \$13.00 for the bus fare. Payment and the permission slip should be returned to the school office by Thursday 12 December 2013.

## Year 2 Tocal Party Day

To celebrate the end of the year, Year 2 will be visiting Tocal on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2013. Children will be able to experience activities involving British Settlement of Australia.

The bus will leave at 9.00 am sharp and return by 3.00 pm. You will need to have your child at school by 8.45 am in time for the morning bus. The bus will leave from the Elizabeth Street side of the school.

The cost for this experience is \$25.00 (\$9.50 Tocal and \$15.50 bus) which should be sent in to the school office with the permission slip by Friday 13<sup>th</sup> December, 2013.

Everyone will need to bring morning tea, lunch and at least 2 cold drinks (water please) as there is no canteen at Tocal. Last year it was quite warm so one frozen water would be good. Students may wear dress up clothes like the olden days or party clothes with closed in shoes and a hat.

Parents are welcome to attend Tocal with the children. There is room on the bus and the cost will also be \$25.00.
