Frozen and canned fruit and vegetables don't count towards your daily intake of fruit and vegetables.



**Fact:**

- Frozen or canned fruit and vegetables are great alternatives when fresh varieties are out of season, unavailable or more expensive.
- Frozen and canned vegetables are usually packed shortly after picking, so there is little nutrient loss.
- Varieties with no added sugar or salt are the best choice (look for tinned fruit in natural juice rather than syrup and tinned vegetables with no added salt.)

## **Major Art Project**

Through the support of The Song Room program, the students and staff of our school will be working together to produce a major art-piece for display within our school. There will also be opportunities for our community to become involved but at this moment, that help we need is in relation to the collection of resources:

A reminder to all parents/carers that children should only be collected early from school where necessary. Teachers organise lessons during the day including in the afternoon in which they need to engage the children and retain their attention. Interruptions can disturb the learning of all of the children in the classroom.

## **PBL Post-It**

Responsible Behaviour on verandahs and stairs – it makes sense when you are older to take your time and walk carefully in public thoroughfares. However, when you are six, seven, and eight or there about; the day needs to be taken at 100 miles per hour. Please encourage your children to think about safety when moving around busy places. Encourage them to consider what may happen if they run into someone elderly and a very young child. Being responsible is a core value of our school and in this case also assists with safety for everyone.

## Singleton Public School's App Is Live

Dear Parents and Carers,

The school has some great news to share with you. Our school smartphone mobile app is now available on both the Apple and Android networks for you to download and start using. These instructions will help you:-

### How to Install Our School App

#### *On Apple*

- On your iPhone open the app store
- Search for our school name
- Press Install
- Enter your iTunes password
- It will commence downloading immediately

#### *Android/Google Play*

- On your SmartPhone open the Android/Google Play market
- Search for our school name
- Press install
- Your app will start installing instantly

### To Open Our School App

- Look for our schools app icon on your phone screen
- Press the icon once
- It will open automatically
- **When prompted select OK to use your current location and OK to send you Push Notifications (this will make sure the google maps and pop-up alerts work for you)**
- Read the information on the screen, and swipe to the left and click on Get Started. You will now be able to select the icons at the bottom of screen to view the School Calendar, Newsletter, Messages and other features.

- Shut down the app and or your phone to refresh the phones memory
- Uninstall your app and reinstall it
