## General Permission to Publish

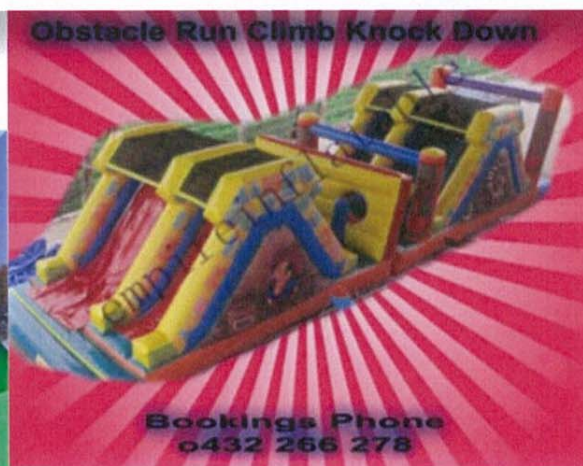

## Drop off and pick up by car
