The simplest way

...to ensure you use sunscreen correctly.

Regular use of sunscreen has been shown to reduce the incidence of melanoma and squamous cell carcinoma, both in the short and long term.

What does sunscreen do?

Sunscreen protects against the damaging effects of the sun by reducing or filtering the amount of ultraviolet (UV) rays that reach the skin.

What is the most effective way to use sunscreen?

- Use at least **SPF 30+ broad spectrum water-resistant** sunscreen.
- **Patch test** sunscreen on a small area of skin – especially if you have not used the product before.
- **Apply and re-apply.** Apply sunscreen 20 minutes before going outside and re-apply every two hours.
- **Apply generously.** Dosage will vary depending on the size of the child. However on an average size child, it is recommended to apply ½ a teaspoon of sunscreen to each arm, leg, front of body, back of the body and the face (including ears and neck).
- **Remember** sunscreen filters out most but not all UV radiation. Use sunscreen in combination with other sun protection methods, including broad brimmed, bucket or legionnaire style hats, sun safe clothing and staying in the shade. Sunglasses are recommended to protect children's eyes.

Hunter Life Van

The 'Healthy Harold' Life Education Van will be at Singleton Public School from Wednesday, 14 June to Thursday 22 June 2017. All classes will visit the van in separate sessions over this period. Each grade follows a different program so it is important for children to participate each year. The programs address many of the components and objectives within the NSW PD/Health/PE curriculum. A brief outline of the program contents is:

Early Stage 1 - Kindergarten - "My Body Matters"

Healthy food choices, importance of physical activity and safety.

Stage 1 - Year 1 - "Ready, Steady, Go"

Body workings, safe use and storage of medicines, peer pressure and coping strategies, safety, decision making.

Stage 1 - Year 2 - "Growing Good Friends"

Unsafe behaviours, situations and environments, healthy food choices.

Stage 2 - Year 3 - "bCyberwise"

Explores cyber safety through animation, vox pops of children, relevant scenarios, discussion and problem solving.

Stage 2 - Year 4 - "Mind Your Medicine"

Safe and unsafe situations, medicines and consequence of misuse, peer influence and friendship, positive communication.

Stage 3 - Year 5 - "On the Case"

Short and long term effects of smoking, effects of passive smoking, laws, peer influence and refusal skills.

Stage 3 - Year 6 - "Think Twice"

Consequences of alcohol use and misuse, stay safe situations and refusal skills, laws controlling purchase and use.

The cost is \$10.00 per child. Permission notes and money must be paid to the class teacher no later than **12.30 pm on Friday, 9 June**. This enables the office staff to compile reports of payment for the class teachers. Please contact Mrs Kerrie Burns in the school office if you are in need of financial assistance – all enquiries are strictly confidential. **The Hunter Life Van is covered by Supercover**, therefore if you have paid Supercover there is no need to pay for this event.

HAROLD PRODUCTS - The separate form attached to the permission note is a list of the items that children can purchase directly from the van. The money for these purchases must be put in an envelope with their name, class and what they want to purchase and **sent in on their allocated day** which will be advised in the school newsletter. Any separate tax deductible donations, as per the attached form, (not including the \$10.00 per child entry) is to be by cheque made out to Life Education NSW and attached to that particular return slip. We will forward it on to Life Education and they will forward you a receipt.

Bandlink 2017

Our school has been invited to participate in BandLink 2017.

BandLink will provide Singleton Public School band students with quality instrumental coaching by tutors who are well qualified and ensemble experience with experienced conductors. It will all occur in a fun and supportive environment.

Korean Connection

Last Tuesday, 16 May, 5/6I connected with our Korean buddy class.

This was our second class with Nabeup Elementary School in South Korea, where students from each class described school life.

5/6I students were amazed to learn the following about their buddy class:

- They go for a walk through Geumsan Park every Monday morning.
- Hello in Korean is: "Anyeonghaseyo"
- They have school meals.
- They attend school from 9am until 2:25pm. After school classes go until 5pm.
- 12 students in their class learn the flute during after school classes.
- Their school motto is: Faithful, Wisely and Strongly.
- They celebrate birthdays for 3 months, every 3 months.
- They have a Maths and Science festival which includes robot soccer, flying drones, building bridges and towers.
- Thank you is: "Kamsahamnida"
- They have assembly once a month on a Monday.
- Jump Rope is Wednesday and Friday.
- One of the students, Sehun, is a gold medallist in Judo.

The Connected Classroom event was also a special occasion in Korea because there were TV crews and journalists in the classroom at the same time to report on the success of the Connected Classroom program. In fact, our Connected Classroom made the TV News in Korea!

5/6I students presented facts about our school life including band, sport, the canteen, our fete, carnivals, library, computer lab, robots, normal class, assembly and we performed our school song.

Our Korean Buddies listened attentively to our presentations and even had some questions for the students at the end of the presentation.

We look forward to our next Connected Classroom in a couple of weeks time.

Change in Circumstances

For some students, the court makes orders that change the contact parents can have with their children or the role they play in making decisions about their children's education. These can be Family Court Orders or Apprehended Violence Orders. Parents can also reach agreement about issues such as contact in a parenting plan.

If this happens in your family, it is important that you provide the school with a copy of any court orders or plan that could impact on your child's education.

In the absence of any notification to the contrary, the school will assume that both parents continue to retain a shared and equal parental responsibility for their children and should be involved in making any decisions regarding their children's education.

This means that the school will recognise that each parent has equal duties, obligations, responsibilities and opportunities in relation to matters involving the school.

If any changes occur in your family relationships which have the potential to impact on the relationship between the school and your family, please advise the school immediately and provide a copy of any court orders that may be obtained.

These orders will be stored securely and only accessed by staff who need to see them in order to plan for your children's learning and support and related issues.

Overdue Library Books

Last week the library sent out reminders about outstanding library books. Overdue notices are sent out with the students every three weeks as a reminder to return any overdue library books. There is currently a large number of books outstanding, with some dating back to 2015. Therefore can parents and carers please ensure that any overdue books are returned as soon as possible to avoid paying extra costs to replace the books.

Head Lice

The school is experiencing a problem with head lice in some classes and we ask that all parents check their children's hair.

Please check your children's hair regularly and if you suspect anything please see your local pharmacist for advice on the correct treatment. Head lice are a regular occurrence in schools and are not a problem if treated quickly and efficiently. Even if children only have eggs they should still be treated.

School Photos

In 2017 John and Tanya Parmenter will once again be taking the Singleton Public School School Photographs. They are members of a national group (MSP Photography) of highly successful photographers committed to providing professional photography and personal service at a competitive price.

MSP Photography use a pre-pay system for their photographic services either cash (correct money only) or you can also make online payments to MSP (see the instructions on the photo envelope for full details). A personalised envelope was sent home to students, giving you the opportunity to order and pay for your children's photographs before they are taken. Please check your child's details are correct and that names are spelt correctly – make any changes in red. They offer a 100% money-back guarantee if you are not completely satisfied with the photographs.

The personalised photo envelope needs to be filled in correctly, payment enclosed or receipt number from online payments written on the envelope, **and returned to school on the Photo Day Monday, 5 June 2017 (Week 7, Term 2).**

Please do not misplace the envelope as it contains a shoot key that enables you to order and pay for the photos online and a barcode for the photographers to scan on the day.

The correct money for each student should be placed in their individual envelope. However, payment for all students in a family can be placed in one envelope. It is important that each member of the family hands in their own personalised envelope to the photographer - one order per envelope please. If you are including one payment for the whole family, the photo envelopes have a section towards the bottom of the envelope to include this information (eg "This envelope is empty, payment is enclosed with Joe Smith, 5E").

Student Council and House Captains to be at school at 8.50 am for 9.00 am photo.

If ordering more than one package of photos or class photo, please indicate clearly by adding the number required next to the appropriate box. (eg x 2).

Family/sibling photo envelopes are now available from the school office. These envelopes will also need to be returned to school on the photo day. The family photos are for Singleton Public School students only.

Group photos will be taken on the day for our Student Council, School Leaders and School House Captains and Vice Captains. These photos are often before school. Children in these groups will need to be at school by 8.50 am and meet at the back of the hall, ready for the group photos at 9.00 am. The photos will be able to be ordered approximately 4 weeks after the school photos. A personalised order form will be sent home once they are available to order with the student's name on it and a notice will also appear in the school newsletter.

Please note: the school office or canteen does not handle change or money for photo day so the correct money is essential. The school office closed for the staff photo from approximately 8.30 - 9.00 am.

Full school uniform must be worn by all students, including navy socks and black shoes.

Eat It To Beat It

Year 3 Outdoor Education Excursion

The Year 3 major excursion for 2017 is a 2-day (over-night) trip to Outdoor Education in Morisset. The excursion supports and enhances our study of PD/PE/Health, as well as contributing to all other areas of development.

During the excursion we are hopeful that the following activities will be available (weather permitting):

*High Ropes *Multi Climb *Night Activity (Country Fair) *Giant Swing *Archery *Bush craft *Bush walk

Travel is by bus which will depart at 9.00 am sharp on Thursday, 14 September and return to school by 3.00 pm on Friday, 15 September. Full information packs will go home closer to the date of the camp. We welcome you to go online and find out more information at; <http://www.outdoorednsw.com.au/morisset/>.

Approximately 60 students and 2 staff will attend the excursion. Due to limited accommodation facilities, we will only be able to take parents whose child's medical needs require them to be present.

APPROXIMATE COST:\$185.00 (Balance of \$135 can only be accepted in Term 3, please see details below.)

This includes: coach travel, accommodation, programmed camp, qualified staff organising and managing camp activities, night activities, meals provided from Lunch on Day 1 to Lunch on Day 2.

To secure a place, students are required to pay a non-refundable deposit of \$50.00, which needs to be paid by 12:30 pm on Friday, 16 June. If no deposit is paid by the due date it will be assumed that your child will not be attending.

Please note: Deposits of \$50.00 ONLY can be taken in Term 2. Please do not make any extra payments for this excursion until the new LMBR finance system is in operation at the beginning of Term 3.

PAYMENT: The balance of money owing needs to be paid to the office by 12.30 pm on Wednesday, 30 August. Parents experiencing financial difficulty are encouraged to speak with their child's teacher or Mrs Burns at the office with regards to the Student Assistance Program. All discussions are private and confidential.

Student Health – Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease

There has been reported cases of Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (Coxsackievirus) within the school community. Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease is a very common viral disease of childhood which is easily passed from person to person. It usually causes a mild illness. Good hygiene helps prevent infection. Please see the facts below taken from the NSW Government Health website:-

What are the symptoms?

Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease may have no symptoms at all or only very mild symptoms. When symptoms do occur, they include blisters that start as small red dots which later become ulcers. Blisters appear inside the cheeks, gums, sides of the tongue as well as on the hands and feet. Blisters usually last for seven to 10 days. Children can sometimes have a low fever, sore throat, tiredness, feel off colour and may be off their food for a day or two. Very rarely, the coxsackie viruses can cause other illnesses that affect the heart, brain, lungs or eyes.

How is it spread?

Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease is usually spread by person-to-person contact ie, contaminated hands, secretions from the mouth or respiratory system and direct contact with the fluid from blisters. It usually takes between three and five days after contact with an infected person before the blisters appear.

How long do children need to be excluded from school?

Please exclude children from school until all of the blisters have dried.
