Before and After School Safety Reminders

We ask that parents and students observe the safety precautions when arriving at and leaving from school.

MORNINGS:

- Students are not to arrive before 8.40 am
- Supervision commences at 8.40 am
- Students who arrive to school on an early bus before the morning play bell MUST sit on the steps outside the kindergarten classrooms and wait until morning bell rings - NO PLAY
- Students may place their bags at their class location after 8.40 am

AFTERNOONS:

- Students must leave the school grounds via the appropriate gates on Hunter or Elizabeth Streets. Carpark and driveway gates are not to be used by students or parents
- Students catching a bus must report to bus lines immediately after being dismissed from class
- Students and parents must use the Hunter and Elizabeth Street Pedestrian Crossings to cross the road. Teachers assist at these crossings to keep our students safe. Please DO NOT call children across the road from the footpath on the other side, between cars or in the middle of the road. The streets are congested during this time and the crossings are the safest place to cross, even if it means walking a little bit further.

Year 4 Sydney Excursion

Students are to arrive at the Elizabeth Street entrance between 6.30 am and 6.45 am on Tuesday, 28 August. We will be leaving at 7.00 am. There is no need to be at school before 6.30 am.

Excursion requirements:

School Uniform: Students are required to wear full school uniform for the excursion outings and must have a school hat to wear for safety purposes.

Backpack with morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea (for the first day only), drink bottle, school hat, pocket money (up to \$40), camera (no IPODS, IPADS, phones or DS are to be brought on the excursion), raincoat, sunscreen, tissues.

Overnight bag with two spare uniforms, pyjamas, toiletries (toothbrush/paste, soap, comb, brush, hair elastics, roll-on deodorant etc.), plastic bags for dirty clothes, pocket money (up to \$40 only) for purchasing opportunities at The Australian Museum and Taronga Zoo, cuddle toy, possibly a book or small game.

Medications : Medication needs to be handed to the teachers prior to getting on the bus. Medications must be in labelled packaging or a Webster pack filled out at the Chemist. Permission for medications must also have been completed.

Beds : Upon arrival at the accommodation the children will be required to make their own beds. Could parents please ensure that their child is able to make a bed from scratch with two flat sheets, by providing them with practice before the trip. The teachers will be inspecting the beds before dinner on the first night.

Behaviour : Whilst we are not expecting any problems please be aware that poor behaviour during the excursion will not be tolerated. Any child misbehaving, refusing to follow instructions, being disrespectful to adults etc. will have their parents/carers contacted and asked to come to Sydney to collect their child. There is also a fifty dollar fine imposed by the accommodation venue for any noise or disruptive behaviour during the night. This will be passed on to the families involved.

Students will return to school on Thursday, 30 August, 2018 at approximately 5.45 pm. The School App will provide updates on the time of arrival. In case of emergency whilst we are away, please contact the school office during school hours or phone 0476 838560 after school hours.

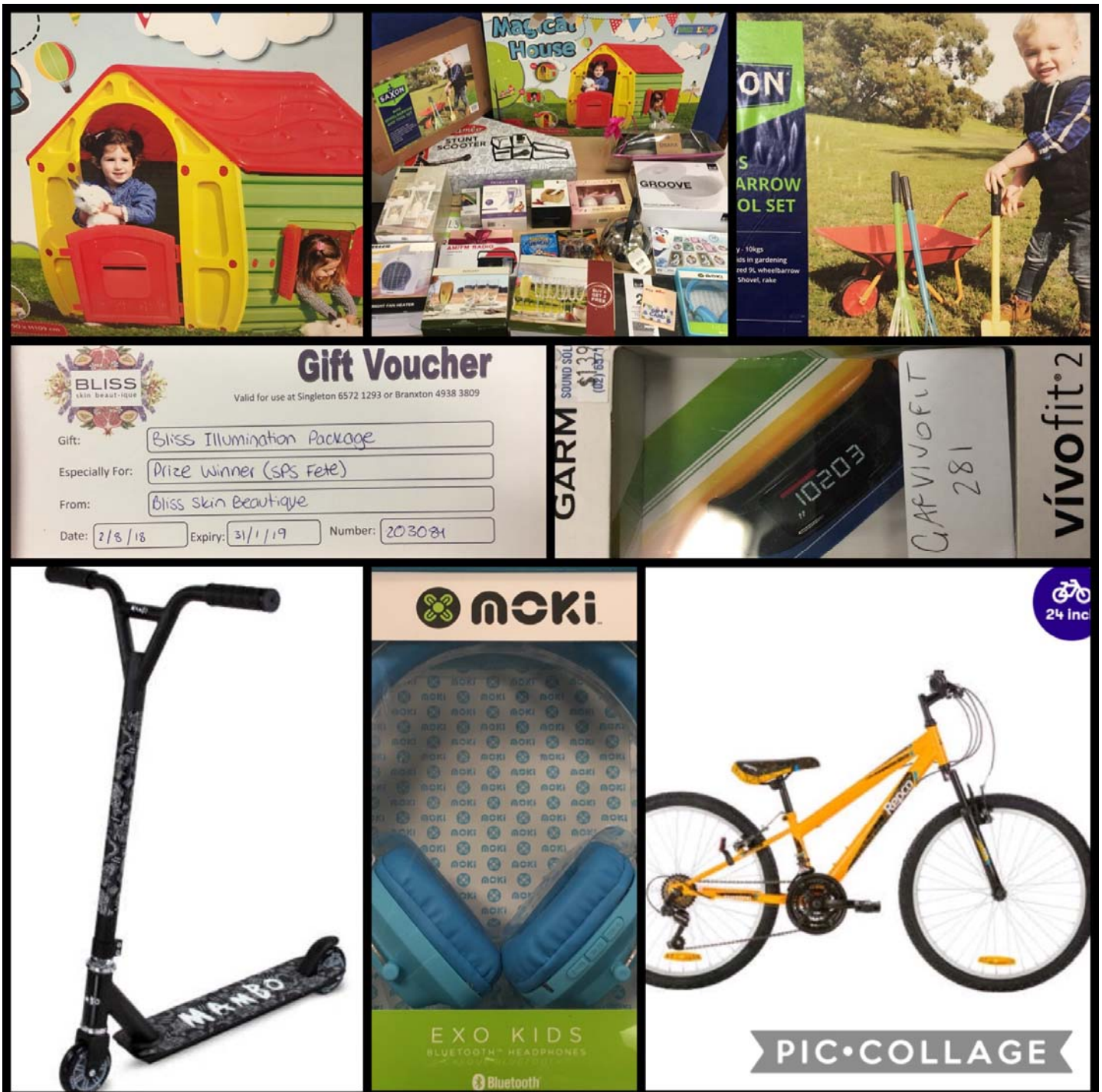

Tell Them from Me Survey

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a *Tell Them From Me* student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 27 August and 26 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

If you **do not** want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by the date advertised on the upcoming letter.
