Year 5 Aussie Bush excursion

The Year Five major excursion to The Great Aussie Bush Camp at Tea Gardens is approaching. The excursion is on Tuesday, 27 November 2018 to Friday, 30 November 2018. The excursion supports and enhances our study of PD/H/PE, as well as encouraging independence and mutual co-operation.

During the excursion, we are hopeful that the following activities will be available (students will be participating in any water activities):

Please find attached The Great Aussie Bush Camp Medical and Activity Restriction Form and a list of what your child is required to take. Students will not be permitted to take any electronic devices such as iPods or cameras on the excursion. The teachers will take photos of the students.

Travel to the venue is by bus. The bus departs at 8:45 am sharp on Tuesday, 27 November 2018 (please be at the school hall by 8.20 am), from the Elizabeth Street entrance of the school. Students will wear comfortable clothes (not school uniform) ready for their first activity when they arrive.

We will arrive back to school at the Elizabeth Street entrance around 3:00 pm on Friday, 30 November 2018. A message about the expected arrival time will be posted on the school app. If students tend to become travel sick, please inform the teachers so they can be seated near the front.

Medication: All medication is to be handed to a teacher in original packaging with script procedures, medication administration times and with a completed medication form. Unsealed or unpackaged medication without student name and delivery instructions cannot be accepted.

Payment: Total cost of the excursion is \$355.00 minus the \$50.00 deposit. All outstanding payments of \$305.00 must be paid to the office by 12.30 pm on Monday, 19 November 2018.

Attendance on excursions will be based on students' demonstrated willingness to follow school rules and compliance with the school's Welfare and Discipline Policies.

Year 5 Teachers

Our Waste Warriors

Year 6 have spent time in Term 3 sorting, sifting, counting and weighing our garbage as part of a science unit of study on waste and recycling. They conducted a waste audit on Stage 3 garbage separating scraps and recyclables then analysing the data to determine what our largest waste issues are.

Fortunately paper, cardboard and plastic drink bottles (thanks to Mrs Wightman and Emma) are currently being recycled each week but we discovered Stage 3 needs to look at reducing soft plastic and more consistently composting food waste.

As part of an action plan we have included more prominent food scrap containers in the Year 6 area and each student had the opportunity to make a wax wrap to use as an alternative to gladwrap or plastic bags (big thank you to Miss Drinan, Mrs Wightman and Mrs Kolatchew for helping with this). It has been wonderful to see these in use, wrapped around pollution-free sandwiches!

Classes 2019

In the coming weeks, the school will begin planning for classes in 2019. In this process, teachers, school executive and the Learning Support Team, use professional judgement to very carefully ensure the correct placement of students in classes for next year.

Occasionally, parents or carers have a specific concern for the wellbeing of their child for consideration in this process. If you have a specific concern, it is important to, firstly, share your concern with the child's class teacher – as they may have a different perspective to add. Having done that, concerns can be put in writing to the attention of the school principal and submitted to the office.

Concerns or requests pertaining to the child's social, academic or emotional wellbeing will be carefully considered within the process. Under the principle of equity, requests for specific classroom teachers for 2019 will not be considered. Submissions might include a comment on a child's capacity to relate to other children, or perhaps a style of teaching that a child has responded positively to previously.

The organisation of classes is a process which is carefully planned. If you have a specific concern, submissions need to be received by the office prior to Friday, 16 November, 2018.

It is usually not possible to move a child to a different class once rolls have been established.

Please also inform the office if your family is relocating in 2019.

School Student Transport Scheme

School student applications for the School Student Transport Scheme in 2019 opened Monday, 15 October 2018.

Students progressing to Year 3 and Year 7 do not need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply. Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, please go online to <https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students should check with their operator for more information.

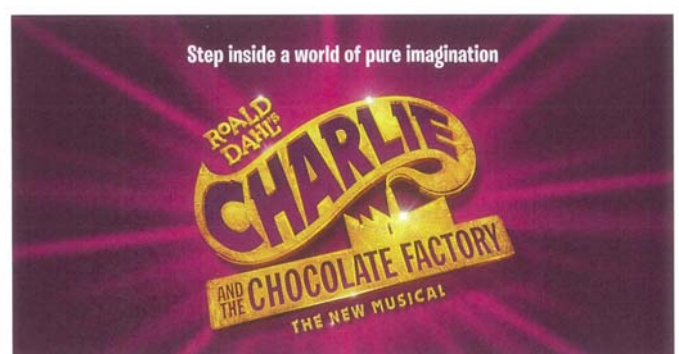
The children will be accompanied by teachers and five parents. The cost for parents will be \$93.50.

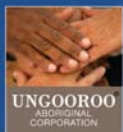

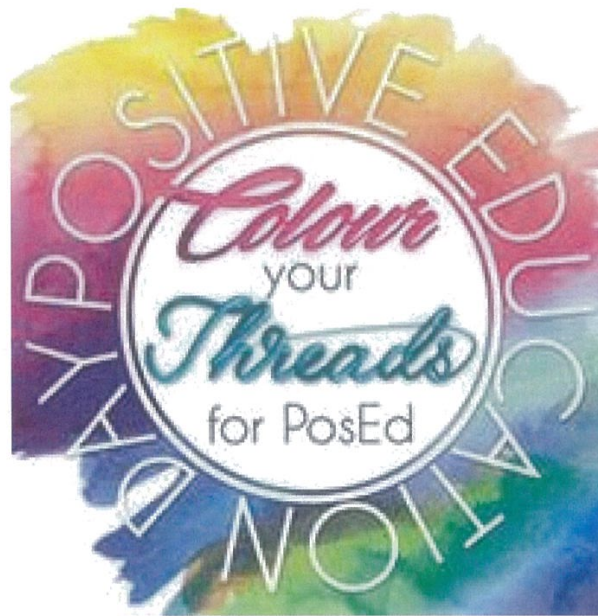
