

Welcome Back to Term 4

It's great to be back to start Term 4 and we are all looking forward to the exciting activities that are quickly approaching. Please keep an eye on the calendar for updates, due dates, events and activities, as we have many great things happening.

If you haven't downloaded our new SZApp please do so as soon as possible so you don't miss important messages and updates. Keep an eye on our Facebook page for pics and reports on school activities and student learning success and achievement.

Playground Update

After countless hours of fundraising and behind the scenes work, our playground upgrade has been submitted to School Infrastructure for the process of estimation and tender design. The project will be managed by School Infrastructure in consultation with the school and P&C. The project is estimated to cost \$165 000.

Massive thanks to the P&C for their contribution of \$65 000 towards our playground upgrade!!

Extended Twilight Professional Learning

Next Tuesday evening, staff will be undertaking the final extended professional learning session from 3.30 - 6.30 pm. Our focus will be on the next part of our Visible Wellbeing education and we are looking forward to embedding these practices in our classrooms, school and our community over the coming years.

With the completion of this session, staff will have completed the hours for the two Staff Development Days held at the end of Term 4. This will mean that there will be no teaching staff in attendance on these days.

2020 Kindergarten

This term we will be welcoming our 2020 Kinder students. Our second parent information session will be held on Monday, 21 October at 6.30 pm. Orientation Day sessions will be held on Thursdays 7, 14, 21 November from 9.10am - 11:10 am.

Parents are invited to attend workshops during this time to get to know one another, gather information on school practices and routines and investigate hands on literacy and numeracy activities.

Kindergarten students are strongly encouraged to attend these sessions, as this is a great time to get to know the school, teachers and the other children they will begin Kindergarten with. Orientation Sessions are also a fantastic opportunity for teachers and students to engage together in routines, practices and activities in readiness for 2020.

Proposed Bus Zone Changes

Singleton Council has been consulting with our school and other local organisations regarding proposed changes to the bus zones for SPS from Elizabeth Street to Hunter Street and the proposal to make Hunter St a one-way thoroughfare to the intersection at Church Street. We have been in consultation with School Infrastructure and Council regarding this proposal and the intended outcomes for students at SPS. The school is in support of the proposal given the increased safety it will provide to our students as they arrive and depart school. The proposed changes discussed would see a safer crossing on Hunter Street, Bus Zones on the school side of Hunter Street with new shelter and gate access, parking spaces remain outside the Parsonage, unrestricted parking on the opposite side of Hunter Street, a signposted 'Kiss and Drop' zone in Elizabeth Street, along with more parking for vehicles.

We will keep everyone updated on the progress of the proposed changes as Council work through their submission process.

Intensive Swimming

In Week 9 of last term, our Year 3 students embarked on their excursion to the Morisset Outdoor Active Education Camp. They were accompanied by Mrs Alaban, Mrs Foster, Mrs Randall and myself.

On arrival we unpacked then got stuck into some morning tea, prior to beginning the first of the organised events. Over the following day-and-a-half we participated in a number of activities: the giant swing (adjusting our stomach), flying fox (fast enough to put a part in my hair), high ropes (tested out stability on a wire with wobbly legs), the multi-climb (really pushing our comfort zones). We did bush survival skills – learning how to make a fire. It did not help that the surrounding resources were wet from rain. Some harnessed up and began an activity and thought they could go no further. However, found that with the encouragement of the camp instructor and their friends on the ground, they could make it all the way to the end! Big congrats to you guys!

On reflection of some of these encounters following our return, students recognised that these are the experiences which allow you to build character and learn new things about yourself.

The staff at Morisset Camp were very professional and helpful in their provision of instruction to the students. They were friendly, informative, always available to assist whenever needed, and they took great care of the students.

I would also like to thank Mrs Alaban, Mrs Foster and Mrs Randall for their assistance on the camp.

Enter to Learn Singleton Public School

Year 2 and selected Years 3 and 4 Intensive Swimming Program 2019

All students in Year 2 and selected Year 3 and 4 students will be attending an Intensive Learn-to-Swim campaign in Term 4, 2019. This will occur every school day over two weeks. This intensive program is a NSW Department of Education initiative; therefore, it is a recommended program for all Year 2 students.

Students will be tested and put into groups according to their ability. Stronger swimmers will receive squad coaching while others may receive coaching on breathing and stroke technique, as well as activities to develop strength and stamina in the water. Therefore it is expected that ALL students participate in the program. Please note: Day 9 will be the assessing day and Day 10 will be Safety Day.

Dates: Monday, 28 October to Friday 8, November 2019 (Weeks 3 and 4 of Term 4)

Cost: \$85.00 (lessons and bus for two weeks)

Payment due: Monday, 21 October, 12.30 pm

Equipment: Swimmers, towel and goggles (clearly labelled) and for Safety Day (Day 10) longs pants and sleeved shirt are required.

Please note: Refunds will not be possible from 21 October 2019 as the Centre has organised the professional swimming teachers and they have a no refund policy. Memberships/season tickets at the Gym & Swim Centre are not valid for learn to swim programs.

We welcome any parents/carers who would like to assist with the program. You do not have to instruct only assist professional instructors.

The session times for the two weeks are as follows: Session 1 (2H, 2PD) 12.30 – 1.15 pm

Session 2 (2Z, 3/4) 1.15 – 2.00 pm

The Gym and Swim requires any volunteers to have a current Working with Children Check while the school requires a completed Appendix 5 form. If you do not have a check, you are able to apply for one online and then have it completed at Service NSW. Simply go to https://www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au/child-safe-organisations/working-with-children-check, complete the online application form, selecting the purpose of check category "Volunteer". You will then be issued with an application number. Take this number and paperwork to the Service NSW with your 100 point check documents eg Birth Certificate (70 points) and Driver's Licence (40 points). Once a Working with Children Check number is issued (it may take a few days) please bring a copy into the school. If you have any queries about this see the office staff. Please indicate on the note if you are able to help.

Classes 2020

In the coming weeks, the school will begin planning for classes in 2020. In this process, teachers, school executive and the Learning Support Team, use professional judgement to very carefully ensure the correct placement of students in classes for next year.

Occasionally, parents or carers have a specific concern for the wellbeing of their child for consideration in this process. If you have a specific concern it is important to, firstly, share your concern with the child's class teacher – as they may have a different perspective to add. Having done that, concerns can be put in writing to the attention of the school principal and submitted to the office.

Concerns or requests pertaining to the child's social, academic or emotional wellbeing will be carefully considered within the process. Under the principle of equity, requests for specific classroom teachers for 2020 will not be considered. Submissions might include a comment on a child's capacity to relate to other children, or perhaps a style of teaching that a child has responded positively to previously.

The organisation of classes is a process which is carefully planned. If you have a specific concern, submissions need to be received by the office prior to Friday,15 November, 2019. It is usually not possible to move a child to a different class once rolls have been established. Please also inform the office if your family is relocating in 2020.

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods and materials. Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 12 March 2020.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2021, you need to apply

Due to circumstances beyond our control, the current version of our school app will no longer be available for use after 31 August.



JUNIOR BLASTERS 5-7yo girls and boys




