Hunter Life Van

The 'Healthy Harold' Life Education Van will be at Singleton Public School from Wednesday, 26 June to Thursday, 4 July 2019. All classes will visit the van in separate sessions over this period. Each grade follows a different program so it is important for children to participate each year. The programs address many of the components and objectives within the NSW PD/Health/PE curriculum. A brief outline of the program contents is:

Support Unit and Early Stage 1 - Kindergarten - "My Body Matters"

Personal hygiene, healthy food choices, importance of physical activity and safety.

Stage 1 - Year 1 – "Ready, Steady, Go"

Benefits of physical activity, body workings, safe strategies, nutritious diet.

Stage 1 - Year 2 – "Growing Good Friends"

Explore what health messages mean, identify safety signs, physical activity and nutrition, positive relationships.

Stage 2 - Year 3 – "bCyberwise"

Explores cyber safety and responsible and respectful behaviour online.

Stage 2 – Year 4 – "Mind Your Medicine"

Medicines and their safe use, positive communication, managing stressful situations and health and wellbeing.

Stage 3 - Year 5 – "On the Case"

Short and long term effects of smoking, effects of passive smoking, laws, peer influence and refusal skills.

Stage 3 - Year 6 – "Relate Respect Connect"

A unique, contemporary module that explores building positive, safe and respectful relationships.

The cost is \$10.00 per child. Permission notes and money must be paid no later than **12.30 pm on Thursday, 25 June**. **The Hunter Life Van is covered by Supercover**, therefore if you have paid Supercover there is no need to pay for this event. **PLEASE NOTE permission notes will sent home in Week 6.**

The Year Three major excursion for 2019 is a two-day (over-night) trip to Outdoor Education in Morisset. The excursion supports and enhances our study of PD/H/PE, as well as contributing to all other areas of development.

- Date:** Thursday, 19 September – Friday, 20 September 2019
- Time:** Departing 9.00am sharp and returning by 3.00pm
- Location:** Outdoor Education in Morisset more information found on website <http://www.outdoorednsw.com.au/morisset/>
- Cost:** \$195.00. This includes: coach travel, accommodation, programmed camp, qualified staff organising and managing camp activities, night activities, meals provided from Lunch on Day One to Lunch on Day Two.
- Deposit:** To secure a place, students are required to pay a non-refundable deposit of \$50.00, which needs to be paid by 12:30pm on Friday, 14 June. If no deposit is paid by the due date it will be assumed that your child will not be attending. No late payments will be accepted.
- Final Payment:** The balance of money owing needs to be paid to the office by 12.30pm on Wednesday, 11 September. Parents experiencing financial difficulty are encouraged to speak with their child's teacher or Mrs Burns at the office with regards to the Student Assistance Program. All discussions are private and confidential.
- Information:** Approximately 65 students and 3 staff will attend the excursion. Due to limited accommodation facilities, we will only be able to take parents whose child's medical needs require them to be present. During the excursion we are hopeful that the following activities will be available (weather permitting): *High Ropes*Multi Climb*Night Activity (Country Fair) *Giant Swing *Archery *Bush craft *Bush walk

School Photos

MSP Photography will be taking the Singleton PS School Photographs on Wednesday, 22 May 2019.

A personalised envelope was sent home to each student, giving you the opportunity to order and pay for your children's photographs before they are taken. Please check your child's details are correct and that names are spelt correctly – make any changes in red. MSP Photography use a pre-pay system for their photographic services either online with credit/debit card or cash (correct money only). Full instructions are on the personalised photo envelopes.

The photo envelope needs to be filled in correctly, payment enclosed or receipt number from online payments written on the envelope, and returned to school on Photo Day Wednesday, 22 May 2019 (Week 4, Term 2).

Please do not misplace the envelope as it contains a shoot key that enables you to order and pay for the photos online and a barcode for the photographers to scan on the day.

The correct money for each student should be placed in their individual envelope. However, payment for all students in a family can be placed in one envelope. It is important that each member of the family hands in their own personalised envelope to the photographer - one order per envelope please. If you are including one payment for the whole family, the photo envelopes have a section towards the bottom of the envelope to include this information (eg "This envelope is empty, payment is enclosed with Joe Smith, 5S").

If ordering more than one package of photos or class photo, please indicate clearly by adding the number required next to the appropriate box. (eg x 2).

Family/sibling photo envelopes are now available from the school office. These envelopes will also need to be returned to school on the photo day. The family photos are for Singleton Public School students only.

Group photos will be taken on the day for our Student Council, School Leaders and School House Captains and Vice Captains. These photos are before school and the children involved will need to be at school at 8.50 am, ready for the photo at 9.00 am sharp. They will meet on the verandah at the back of the school hall (under the COLA). The photos will be able to be ordered approximately 4 weeks after the school photos. A personalised order form with the student's name on it will be sent home once they are available to order and a notice will also appear in the school newsletter.

Please note: the school office or canteen does not handle change or money for photo day so the correct money is essential.

The school office closed for the staff photo from approximately 8.30 - 9.00 am.

Full school uniform must be worn by all students, including navy socks and black shoes.

University of New South Wales ICAS Tests

Each year the University of New South Wales offers students across the world the opportunity to participate in a number of tests across a number of curriculum areas for children in Year 3-12.

These tests are the International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) and occur through the year. A new ICAS test is developed annually for each subject in each year level by our team of subject matter experts.

All ICAS tests are reviewed by experienced teachers to ensure that they accurately assess students' skills and are relevant to what they are learning at school. Each test is sat at the student's school and is invigilated by teachers under normal examination conditions.

This year we are offering for any interested children from Years 3-6 the chance to participate in the following UNSW competitions:

- Digital Technologies (Computer Skills): Tuesday, 3 September
- Science: Thursday, 5 September
- English: Tuesday, 17 September
- Mathematics: Thursday, 19 September

Bus safety for school students

How families can help



Safety information



Getting to and from the bus stop

- Families are responsible for getting their child to and from the bus stop safely.
- Always supervise your child until they are at least 10 and hold their hand when walking to and from the bus stop or interchange and when crossing the road.
- When waiting for the bus, hold hands and wait as far back from the passing traffic as possible.

Getting off the bus

When travelling by bus, your child is most at risk in the minutes after they get off the bus.

Meet your child AT the bus stop or interchange after school. NEVER wait on the opposite side of the road and call them across. If you cannot meet your child, organise for a trusted adult to take your place.

Always wait until the bus has gone, then use a safe place to cross.

Talk with your child about what to do:

- if you are delayed and cannot meet them as usual
- if they catch the wrong bus
- if they get off the bus at the wrong bus stop.

Crossing the road

Together, choose the safest place to cross the road and talk about:

STOP! one step back from the kerb
LOOK! continuously both ways
LISTEN! for the sounds of approaching traffic
THINK! whether it is safe to cross

Keep checking as you cross the road.

40km/h when passing bus flashing lights



Driving near buses

Bus lights flash on the front and back of a bus when the bus is picking up or setting down school children. A 40km/h speed limit applies when bus lights flash. The speed limit is for all traffic travelling in the same direction as the bus, whether the bus is stationary or moving.

Informal school bus stops

Informal bus stops are not sign posted and are usually found in rural areas. They may be at the front of a property or on the side of the road.

Drivers may find it difficult to see children at informal bus stops. Families should take special care when using these stops. Staying on the bus a bit longer to travel to another bus stop may reduce the need for your child to have to cross the road.
