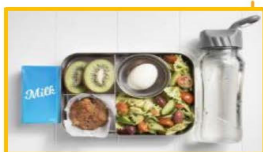
## The simplest way

Activities: Dip netting, Wetlands Education session, Wet room scientific investigations, Wetlands walk and discovery session.

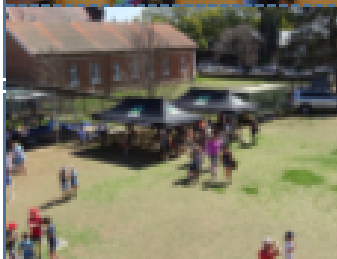
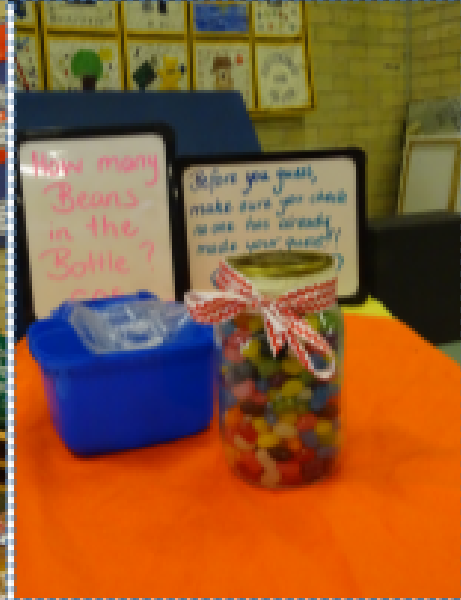
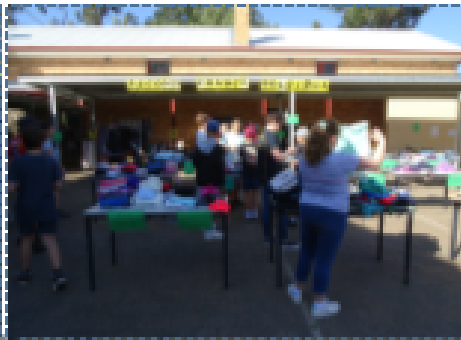
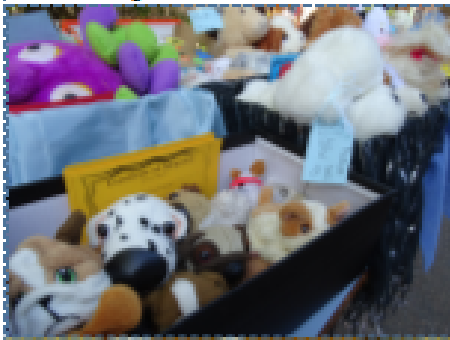
Parent Helpers: Due to limited seating and the small rooms at the centre parent helpers are not required.

Due to circumstances beyond our control, the current version of our school app will no longer be available for use after 31 August.

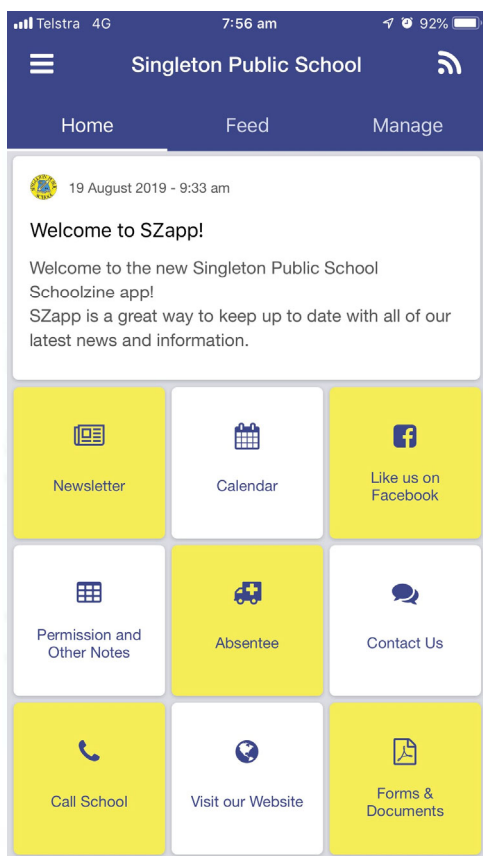

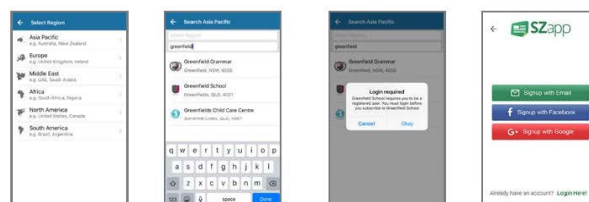

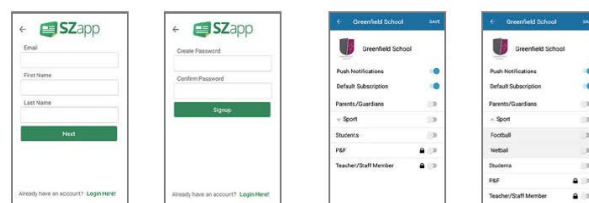
