From the Principal

Welcome back for our final term of 2020. While COVID19 restrictions and guidelines remain in place for the safety of our whole community we are looking forward to participating in a number of exciting activities and events with our students.

Thank you to our parents for their continued ongoing support and adherence to the procedures during 2020. While there are a number of activities planned for Term 4 they will be conducted without parent spectating and attendance. We will do our very best to photograph and video as much as possible to share with families on Facebook and through Seesaw, with our main aim in ensuring all students are having a positive, engaged and fun experience.

Canberra

We held out as long as possible with our Canberra excursion in the hope that COVID restrictions may change. Unfortunately interstate excursions are still not allowed and Canberra is cancelled for 2020. We have however, been able to secure an additional booking at Great Aussie Bush Camp for Year 6. This is open to all Year 6 students who would like to attend, regardless of whether they were planning on attending Canberra or not. GABC will be a wonderful opportunity for Year 6 to finish off their last primary term with challenges, fun and Team 6 bonding.

Gymnastics

We are very excited to have been able to secure an external sporting and coaching program for SPS for Term 4. With limited sporting opportunities this year we have engaged Primarily Active to come to school and deliver a gymnastics program for all classes K-6, including 7B and 7W. The trained coaches and assistants will deliver an important part of our PE curriculum and will bring all equipment and materials required for the lessons. Intensive Swimming for Year 2 and Selected Year 3 and 4

Please note that the Intensive Swimming Program may have to be cancelled depending on the Government and Department of Education COVID19 restrictions and guidelines that are in place at that time. As at 12 October 2020 the swimming program will be going ahead.

All students in Year 2 and selected Year 3 and 4 will be attending an Intensive Learn-to-Swim campaign in Term 4, 2020. This will occur every school day over two weeks. This intensive program is a NSW Department of Education initiative; therefore, it is a recommended program for all Year 2 students.

Students will be tested and put into groups according to their ability. Stronger swimmers will receive squad coaching while others may receive coaching on breathing and stroke technique, as well as activities to develop strength and stamina in the water. Therefore it is expected that ALL students participate in the program. Please note: Day 9 will be the assessing day and Day 10 will be Safety Day.

Dates: Monday, 26 October to Friday 6, November 2020 (Weeks 3 and 4 of Term 4)

Cost: \$70.00 (lessons and bus for two weeks) by Parent Online Payment

Payment due: Monday, 19 October, 12.30 pm

Equipment: Swimmers, towel and goggles (clearly labelled) and for Safety Day (Day 10) longs pants and a long sleeved shirt are required. Due to COVID-19 we ask that students bring a second towel as they will be returning to school in their wet swimmers.

Please note: Refunds will not be possible from 19 October 2020 as the Centre has organised the professional swimming teachers and they have a no refund policy. Memberships/season tickets at the Gym & Swim Centre are not valid for learn to swim programs.

The session times for the two weeks are as follows:

Session 1 (2M, 2NP, 2Z) 12.30 – 1.15 pm Session 2 (Years 3/4) 1.15 – 2.00 pm

Please note that parent helpers will not be required this year due to COVID-19.

ASCIA Survey

The Australasian Society of Clinical Immunology and Allergy (ASCIA) is in the process of developing minimum standards for the management of anaphylaxis in schools and early childhood education centres across Australia, following a review of all state and territory policies and guidelines.

The next phase in the development of these standards, is to engage with parents/guardians of children with severe allergies who are currently enrolled in school and/or childcare services, in an online survey.

The purpose of the survey is to identify key issues in anaphylaxis management in schools and childcare settings. The information collected will assist in the development of nationally consistent standards that effectively prevent, recognise and treat anaphylaxis.

The surveys are anonymous and will take approximately 15 minutes to complete, with the survey closing at midnight on Friday, 23 October 2020. The survey can be found at https://nationalallergystrategy.org.au/projects/school-and-ecec.

Library Bookfair

On the day of the bookfair, students will be able to hand in their wish list with the receipt number and books required to the library staff to organise their order.

Reporting COVID19 Tests to school





Year Six Canberra Excursion

As you are aware, we have been waiting for the Department of Education to release their guidelines regarding excursions. This information came out at the end of Term 3 and there were some updates added during the holiday break.

Although excursions including overnight excursions are now permitted, interstate travel is not permitted.

This means that the Year 6 Canberra excursion has been cancelled.

We have looked at several other options and are pleased to announce that we have been successful in gaining a position at Aussie Bush Camp for Year 6!

We are excited that Year 6 will still be able to have an excursion in 2020 to celebrate their last year at Singleton Public School.

Intention to apply for Year 7 placement in a selective high school in 2022

Dear Parent/Carer

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday, 11 March 2021.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2022, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available in late September 2020 at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7.

The application website opens at that link on 6 October 2020 and closes on 9 November 2020. You must apply before the closing date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after 6 October 2020.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

Term 4 Guidelines and Update 25.09.2020

Dear Parents and Carers,

SPS staff would like to extend our thanks and gratitude to our school community for the support and understanding shown during our rapidly changing and unprecedented year so far. We have faced many challenges and 'outside the box' thinking to continue as many of our school activities as permitted.

As we head into Term 4, there have been some changes to activities we are able to undertake. The reinstating of Kinder Orientation, Year 7 transition and excursions (in NSW at this stage) are certainly events we are all looking forward to.

While non-essential adults are still not permitted on school grounds or at school events, we are already planning and organising ways to ensure parents, carers and families will have some aspect of involvement in major Term 4 events that meet our NSW DoE guidelines.

While the majority of our processes for Term 4 will remain unchanged, we are developing our plans for those events and activities we can now hold. Information for specific activities and school events will be communicated in Term 4.

Please read the information below for a summary of the Advice for Families which can be found on the NSW DoE website: https://education.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/advice-for-families.

Schools are operating full time while actively following health advice.

Schools continue to be safe, and operations are in line with Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) and NSW Health advice. All students should be learning on campus unless they are unwell or have a medical certificate to support their absence.

The activities that are permitted at school will be conducted in a way that is safe and appropriate in the current environment. Those that remain on hold will be reviewed during the term and will recommence when appropriate based on health and other relevant advice.

Check the latest COVID-19 case locations in NSW and follow the recommended actions if you have been in a location where there have been confirmed cases of COVID-19. We encourage members of the community to monitor this site.

School attendance

Students should be at school unless:

- they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an
 ongoing medical condition and the expected timeframe,
- they are currently unwell.

In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded NOT to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms.

NSW Health has requested that schools encourage anyone who is unwell or has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics. Students and staff with flu-like symptoms will need to be tested and provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result and be symptoms free before being permitted to return to school.

<u>NEW INFORMATION</u>: Students who do not undertake a COVID-19 test result will not be permitted to return to school for a 10 day period. Additionally, they must be symptom free for at least 3 days prior to returning to school.

SEASONAL ALLERGY AND HAYFEVER NEW INFORMATION: Students who have seasonal allergic rhinitis or another condition that presents similarly to flu-like symptoms are still required to get tested for COVID-19 and return a negative test result. Where their symptoms continue beyond 10 days, students should provide documentation from their GP confirming their symptoms are typical for their condition. If the student develops new or changed symptoms, they should get tested for COVID-19. Find more information about COVID-19 symptoms.

COVID-19 testing for students with complex health or disability may be challenging. In these situations, schools will ask the parent or carer to have their child assessed by their medical practitioner. Where a medical practitioner determines that a COVID-19 test is not required, documentation must be provided to the school to confirm that the student does not have symptoms that warrant a COVID-19 test. The certificate must also indicate that the student is able to return to school.

Hygiene

All schools will be vigilant when implementing infection control, physical distancing and personal hygiene protocols to protect the health and safety of students and staff. Schools will promote the need to follow good hygiene practices such as:

- regularly washing hands
- · avoiding sharing drinks or food
- coughing or sneezing into your elbow, or a tissue which should be discarded immediately
- · filling water bottles from bubblers rather than using the bubbler directly.

School activities and school site usage

What's changed:

The following activities can now proceed for Term 4:

- Saturday School for Community Languages will return to face-to-face learning.
- Interschool activities
- · Singing and chanting with strict restrictions
- Playing wind instruments with strict restrictions
- School formals, dances and graduations with a COVID-19 Safety Plan
- Excursions and day camps with strict restrictions
- Kindergarten orientation with strict guidelines
- Year 7 transition to high school.

The following principles underpin these measures:

- Where possible, students will stay within their relevant cohort group (i.e. class, year group, or stage) for all learning activities within their school in order to limit close contacts to the relevant student cohort.
- Interschool activities can now take place.
- Only providers that are essential to the delivery of curriculum can continue to provide services and programs until further notice.
- Non-essential adults are still not permitted on school grounds or at school events. This includes
 parents and carers except for face-to-face parent/teacher meetings that are essential (e.g. to
 discuss disciplinary or other welfare matters).
- Parent volunteers to support educational purposes are welcome for <u>scheduled activities</u> such as reading groups and kitchen garden programs. These volunteers must sign an <u>external visitors</u> <u>form</u> upon entry to the school as well as following SPS sign in procedures. Educational volunteers and processes will be scheduled and managed by the SPS executive team when required to support students and staff during Term 4.*
- Singing and other chanting activities can take place as a solo or in a small group as long as participants are 5 metres away from other people and 1.5 metres away from one another. Groups of up to 5 people can include students from different year groups.
- Musical instruments activities can proceed provided students playing non-reeded woodwind
 instruments are 3 metres apart and all other performers playing musical instruments are 1.5 metres
 apart.
- Singing and band rehearsals and performances should take place outside or in well ventilated indoor spaces
- School formals, dances, graduation or other social events are permitted provided they meet strict COVID-19 Safety Plan.

Activities and site usage that can take place:

- Students can use the school library.
- Students can engage in sporting activities.
- School sporting events and activities held within the school site during school hours must not involve spectators including parents and carers. The only exception is when there is an explicit request from the school to support the delivery of curriculum.
- Parent volunteers to support educational purposes are welcome for scheduled activities such as reading groups and kitchen garden programs. *See above.

- School sporting events and activities held outside of the school site during hours will need to follow the <u>COVID-19 Safety Plan</u> of the venue or organiser.
- Canteens and uniform shops can open at the principal's discretion.
- School assemblies must be limited to 15 minutes with no external visitors.
- Students may attend other schools for essential curriculum-related reasons or placements (e.g. auditions or placement tests).
- Incursions or external providers can provide activities that support delivery of curriculum (e.g. music tutors, sport skills development programs, science demonstrations, drama tutors, Healthy Harold).
- Excursions and day field trips within NSW (e.g. DoE Environmental Education Centres and sport and recreation facilities, trips to the local river to collect water samples) can occur from Term 4.
- Overnight activities can occur from Term 4 in accordance with strict COVID safe requirements.
- · Kindergarten orientation in Term 4
- Year 7 transition to high school in Term 4 after 12 November.
- P&C meetings and events must be on-line only.
- Parent/teacher meetings will be online unless involving serious matters that require face to face discussion.

Activities on hold

The following events will continue to be reconsidered in Term 4. For now, these events must remain on hold.

- Interstate excursions
- International excursions (cancelled until further notice)
- Face-to-face professional learning for staff
- Parent and carer attendance at assemblies and other school events
- School-based activities that involve large gathering of adults. These include parent/community
 gatherings such as parent functions, working bees, fundraisers, school barbecues, large parent
 information evenings and large on-site cultural events.
- P&C meetings should continue online only. P&C social events or functions including dinners, fundraisers, fetes and barbecues that involve parents and other adults are not permitted in Term 4.

Physical distancing

Physical distancing of students in schools is not required under the AHPPC guidelines.

All teachers, support staff and parents must maintain physical distance from each other (1.5m).

Parents should ensure school pick up and drop off arrangements enable them to physically distance from one another and from staff. As such, schools should ensure school pickup and dropoff arrangements enable parents to physically distance from one another and from staff. Schools should consider strategies to avoid large congregations during school pickup and dropoffs. SPS will continue with our current Term 3 drop off and pick up procedures as we commence Term 4.

Year 6 assemblies and farewell

Further information will be provided in Term 4 for these events. At this stage the Year 6 assembly will be for students and staff only. We are exploring livestreaming, recording and virtual platforms to share with parents, carers and families. The Year 6 farewell will be held in December for students. Details regarding this will be provided next term.
