Dear Parents and Carers

Re: Medications

Thank you for the request for your child to start receiving medication at school. Please see the following processes for the Administering of Medication at school:-

- Only prescribed medications are administered at Singleton Public School. This includes over the counter medications such as Panadol and antihistamines – they will only be accepted and administered if prescribed by a doctor.
- Parents/carers requesting the school to give their child any medications need to complete and sign a Request for Administering Prescribed Medication sheet.
- All medication needs to be:-
 - **Delivered to the school office by an adult** and cannot be delivered to the office by students.
 - All medication needs to be
 - **delivered in its original packaging and box with prescription label** attached even if only one sheet of tablets is enclosed OR
 - in a **webster pack** from the chemist.
 - Tablets cannot be put into a weekly container and cannot be cut in half as they need to be left in the sealed foil pack so that the medication is clearly identifiable.
 - If students require **half a tablet**, the preferred option is for parents/carers to use the webster pack system from the chemist.

These procedures align the school with the Department of Education procedures regarding administering medication.
